[The Naming and History of Magura](#)

"The boy slept, the neighborhood was filled with people, the bargy came to the country"

This popular rhyme is believed to have spread through the names of pirates named Magur and Bargi.

Magura is a prosperous town in the southwestern part of Bangladesh. Jessore was the first district formed in the Bengal province during the British rule in 1786. Basically, it makes it impossible for a district officer to control the law and order situation and perform administrative work in a large district. In addition, Magura was made the first subdivision of Jessore district in 1845 to protect the people of this area from the pirates known as the Mags and Bargis. These Mughal pirates were called Magra in the local language. It is said that the name Magura originated from this Magra. Magura was elevated from a subdivision to a district in 1984 as part of administrative decentralization.

[District and Sessions Judge's Court](#)

The District and Sessions Judge's Court was established in Magura on September 1, 1984. The first District and Sessions Judge was Mr. Khondaker Md. Abu Bakr. There are two Additional District and Sessions Judge Courts, two Joint District and Sessions Judge Courts, two Senior Assistant Judge Courts and two Assistant Judge Courts in Magura. Currently, 17,284 cases are pending in the Magura District and Sessions Judge Court.

[Magistrate's Court](#)

The Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court, Magura was established on November 1, 2007. The first Chief Judicial Magistrate of this district was Sheikh Jalal Uddin. Currently, there are a total of 05 courts in this district, including the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court, Senior Judicial Magistrate's First Court, Senior Judicial Magistrate's Second Court, Judicial Magistrate's First Court, and Judicial Magistrate's Second Court. There are four police stations in this district, namely Magura Sadar, Mohammadpur, Shalikha and Sreepur. Currently, a total of 4087 cases are pending.

Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal

The Women and Children Abuse Prevention Tribunal was established in Magura district in 2018. Previously, the learned District and Sessions Judge performed the duties of a judge of this tribunal in addition to his own duties. The first judge of this tribunal was Mr. Md. Jamiul Haider.

Land Survey Tribunal

There is a Land Survey Tribunal in Magura. The Land Survey Tribunal was established in 2013.

District Legal Aid Office

There is a legal aid office in Magura district. Here, legal services, including dispute resolution and legal advice, are provided free of cost to the poor and needy. Court infrastructure

The District and Sessions Judge's Court is a two-storey building. The work on the nine-storey building of the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court is underway. Currently, the entire activities of the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court are being conducted in the main two-story building of the District and Sessions Judge's Court.

Magura Bar Association

There is a traditional Bar Association in Magura. The Bar Association was established in 1906. The current president of the Magura Bar Association is Advocate Md. Abu Ayub Biswas and the secretary is Advocate Md. Sajidur Rahman Sangram. Currently, there are 270 learned lawyers enrolled in this traditional bar.
